

## Ning Screenshots

### Shot 1

This first shot shows the ning site we have created. We have deliberately branded the site to make it feel like part of the University of Bradford website to help students feel that they are part of an official site. Student feedback has been helpful in deciding on the layout and design of the site as they have told us how important it is to them that they feel they are part of an official site.

You will see that we have created links to other sites that are relevant to students such as the student union facebook group and twitter feed. We also place links to important surveys here that we want students to complete.

We have a site recent activity feed which updates with information about what is happening on the site.

### Shot 2

One important aspect to remember is that this ning site is totally open to the world. Privacy is therefore very important. We have included a statement about privacy and security here and ensure that students are familiar with it when registering with the site.

### Shot 3
